On 26 May 2017, over 250 Indigenous Delegates gathered at the 2017 First Nations' National Constitutional Convention in Uluru and made a historic statement. Through the Uluru Statement From The Heart the Delegates seek constitutional and structural reform that establishes a First Nations Voice enshrined in the Constitution and a Makarrata Commission to supervise a process of agreement making between governments and First Nations.
