

Conference Welcome

A warm welcome to the annual conference from the ADR Committee of the Bar Association of Queensland to be held at the Sheraton Grand Mirage Resort, Gold Coast on Saturday 28 and Sunday 29 October 2017.

The conference entitled "Different Perspectives with a Focus on the Future" will bring together practitioners for thought-provoking professional development and learning.

In a unique format, and consistent with the conference theme, our guest, Lee Jay Berman, will facilitate us through a tribute to the movies *Rashomon* and *Inside Out* – taking a single fact pattern of a dispute and using exercises, interactive discussion, and some lecture, will lead us through viewing and analyzing that simulation through multiple lenses and perspectives. This highly interactive exercise, will take one single scenario of a commercial/business partnership mediation case, broken down and analyzed through various lenses (legal, psychological, business, negotiation, and creative problem solving). The goal is to help us all see what we may be missing when we focus on just one perspective in our mediations. This workshop is intended to help seasoned mediators open their eyes more widely, see different layers, and view the dispute that's in front of them through different lenses, allowing them to access more of their own creativity, and expand our tool boxes, all unlocking the possibilities for potential resolutions. Additionally, at the end of this exercise, and moving into Sunday's session, he will show us how Impasse is a Fallacy, and there is always a way to resolve a case, being as creative as we are capable of being.



Keynote Speaker





Lee Jay Berman

Lee Jay Berman began as a full-time mediator over 20 years ago and he has successfully mediated over 1,900 matters.

He mediates nationally through PMA Dispute Resolution based in the Century City area of Los Angeles. He is a national panelist with the American Arbitration Association, a Distinguished Fellow with the International Academy of Mediators, a Charter Diplomat with both the National Academy of Distinguished Neutrals, internationally certified by the International Mediation Institute, and a Dispute Resolution Expert with the United Nations Development Programme.

California's Daily Journal twice named him "Top Neutral", Acquisition International Magazine awarded him "Mediator of the Year – California" in 2012- 2014, and he has been voted by his colleagues into the Who's Who of International Commercial Mediation in 2012-2014. Lee Jay founded the American Institute of Mediation, leaving his position as Director of Pepperdine Law School's Mediating the Litigated Case program after seven years. He has also lectured at Southwestern Law School, University of Texas, Southern Methodist University, Lipscomb University, Cal-State Northridge and University of California, Santa Barbara.

Lee Jay has trained judges, attorneys and business leaders in India, Australia, Croatia, Jordan, The Netherlands, and the United Arab Emirates.

He came and spoke at the Queensland Bar's ADR Conference in 2012 and has been seen to wear the Association's tie in many parts of the world.
