Would you like to learn more about the practice of international law? The International Law Section (ILS) of the Law Council of Australia will hold a course in 2018 consisting of ten lectures specifically designed for young lawyers with at least one year in practice. Lectures will be held monthly, with a short assessment task and a certificate of completion upon conclusion.

The program will address questions you might encounter in practice, such as how to draft arbitration and choice of law clauses; how to deal with international sales of goods and CISG problems; how does the WTO work; understanding UNCITRAL texts; how do civil law contracts work in Asia and Europe; what conflicts of law issues may arise in your practice; as well as an introduction to a range of public international law topics.

The seminars will be held on the first Tuesday of each month from February to November at 7.45am-9.00am at various places in Sydney CBD. The cost is \$285 (GST included), which includes membership of the ILS through to June 2019 or \$55 per lecture. The course is available to all lawyers, although the primary focus is on educating younger members of the profession.
