Many statutes confer power in broad terms, leaving it to decision-makers, litigants and courts to discern the limits on power. The paper outlines mechanisms in Australian law, and particularly the Constitution, for controlling the exercise of broadly-framed powers. It looks at emerging issues in this area, including whether constitutional limitations are mandatory relevant considerations, whether powers which burden constitutional freedoms are subject to proportionality constraints and whether courts can have regard to the risk that a power will be abused in assessing the validity of its conferral.
