Michael Donald Kirby is an Australian jurist and academic who is a former Justice of the High Court of Australia, serving from 1996 to 2009. From 1983 to 1984, he was a judge in the Federal Court of Australia and the youngest man appointed to the federal judiciary. In 2013 he was appointed by the President of the UN Human Rights Council to head the Commission of Inquiry on Alleged Human Rights Violation in the Democratic People's Republic of Korea.
