1.5 HOUR SEMINAR1.5 CPD/CLE POINTS IN THE SUBSTANTIVE LAW STRAND

Although English is the first and main language of Aboriginal people in NSW, subtle dialectal differences have emerged in Aboriginal English over two centuries. This session will present some of these differences, focusing on the impact on intercultural communication between lawyers and Aboriginal English speaking clients and witnesses. It will also explore implications for practice and procedure.

Dr Diana Eades is a sociolinguist who specialises in intercultural communication and language in the legal process, particularly focusing on the use of English by, to, and about Aboriginal people. Her publications include the lawyers' handbook *Aboriginal English and the Law* (1992, Queensland Law Society).
