**Justice Hilary Hannam** was a magistrate in the Local Court of NSW from 2000 until August 2010 when she was appointed as the Chief Magistrate of the Northern Territory. In 2013 Her Honour was appointed to the Family Court of Australia.

Ms Cheryl Orr is a Gurang Gurang woman. Cheryl lives and practices in Sydney and Mt Druitt as a specialist in Child & Protection matters. She is the Indigenous Legal Professional of the Year 2014, awarded by the Commonwealth Attorney-General.
