## EXTENSION OF CLOSING DATE:

### Expressions of Interest: ACT Supreme Court Mediators Panel

Following multiple requests from practitioners wishing to undertake accreditation as a mediator the ACT Supreme Court has decided to extend the closing date for expressions of interest to be placed on the ACT Supreme Court Mediators Panel for 2025. Expressions of interest now close on **21 March 2025**.

The ACT Supreme Court is seeking expressions of interest from persons who are:

- Registered as nationally accredited mediators; and
- Legal practitioners who are or eligible for admission as a practitioner of the High Court or the Supreme Court of an Australian State or Territory; with at least 5 years post admission experience; and
- Have extensive experience in civil litigation.

To be placed on a panel of mediators to undertake mediations in the civil jurisdiction of the Court on the following terms:

- Mediators fees are paid directly to the mediator within the time frame directed by the Court.
- The fee shall be \$1800 (inclusive of GST) per mediation;
- Mediations will be for a maximum of 4 hours unless otherwise agreed by the parties and the mediator;
- Mediations will be held at the ACT Law Courts Building unless otherwise agreed in advance by the parties, the mediator and the Registrar of the ACT Supreme Court

Expressions of interest should be limited to one page and be accompanied by a CV and confirmation of relevant qualifications. Applications which do not include all of these documents will not be considered.

Persons who have previously been included on the panel of mediators will need to reapply to be included on the

panel for calendar year 2025.
