(*nar-lee-ah*) at **Wesley Conference Centre**, on Gadigal Country, Sydney 16-17 October 2023. Proceedings will be recorded and live-streamed for virtual attendees.

Conference theme and sub-themes

The theme of this year's conference is **Recognition and Reckoning** - with a core focus on First Nations self-determination and the pursuit of justice. Keynote speakers will include leading Indigenous academics, practitioners and activists.

- First Nations futures and Indigenous self-determination
- Reforms post-referendum: treaty and truth telling processes
- Racism in sport: protecting First Nations athletes
- Police accountability
- Strengthening and protecting Indigenous children
- First Nations lawyering
- Indigenous laws, legal pluralism and First Nations justice
