The distinguished panel will discuss important aspects of judging in practice. The topics to be covered include: finding facts; decisions on the papers; writing judgments; case management; closed hearings; and ex tempore judgments. **Sir Ross Cranston QC**, Professor of Law at the London School of Economics and a former judge of the High Court, Queen's Bench Division, will be the Chair.

**Lord Justice (James) Dingemans** is Vice-President of the Queen's Bench Division and has been heavily involved in the Commonwealth Magistrates and Judges Association and the Commonwealth Lawyers' Association



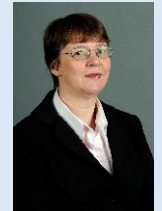
**Justice Julie Ward** has been the Chief Judge in Equity of the Supreme Court of New South Wales since 2017, having been appointed to the Supreme Court in 2008



**Mrs Justice Cheema-Grubb** is a High Court judge and Senior Presiding Judge on the South-eastern Circuit. Dame Bobbie was Senior Treasury Counsel prior to her appointment, prosecuting heavy crime



**Justice Susan Kenny AM** is the senior puisne judge of the Federal Court of Australia having been appointed to that Court in 1998. She was formerly a judge of the Court of Appeal, Supreme Court of Victoria



**Mrs Justice Cockerill** is a High Court judge and the Judge in Charge of the Commercial Court. Dame Sara is a noted medieval historian, the author of *Eleanor of Castile* (2014) and *Eleanor of Aquitaine* (2020)



**Justice Katrina Banks-Smith** is a judge of the Federal Court of Australia having been appointed to that Court in 2018. She was formerly a judge of the Supreme Court of Western Australia
