

Queensland Integrity Commissioner

- High profile role
- Officer of the Queensland Parliament
- Advises on ethics and integrity matters

The Integrity Commissioner is an officer of the Queensland Parliament appointed under the Integrity Act 2009. The role's functions are to provide confidential advice on ethics and integrity issues to designated persons and former designated persons, administer the lobbyist register, monitor the interaction of lobbyists and raise public awareness of ethics and integrity issues.

You will be advising a range of people including Ministers, Assistant Ministers, Members of the Legislative Assembly, Statutory Office Holders, Chief Executives, other senior executives across government and other persons or classes of persons nominated by a Minister.

The Integrity Commissioner is also required to report to the Speaker of the Queensland Parliament and Economics and Governance Committee annually on the performance of the Commissioner's functions.

The role requires a demonstrated commitment to, and understanding of, ethical behaviour and integrity, and experience in resolving complex conflicts of interest. You must demonstrate the capacity to provide clear and unambiguous written and oral advice requiring effective communication skills. You must also have the confidence and presence to speak publicly on policy and practice relevant to the Integrity Commissioner's functions and responsibilities.

The engagement is for a term of up to five years. A competitive salary package will be offered to the preferred candidate.
