

Holmes J once said that "We too need education in the obvious". By three seemingly straightforward examples – a slip and fall on a council footpath, the requirement that a testator know and approve of a will, and the nature of assessable income under s 26(a) of the Income Tax Assessment Act – this presentation will explore the interaction between judge-made law and statute law, which occurs daily in legal reasoning and argument and judgments, often without a conscious appreciation of the complexity and nuance which is involved. This presentation draws upon the themes in Justice Mark Leeming's new book <u>Common Law, Equity and Statute: A Complex Entangled System.</u>
